On May 9, 2011, San Diego Gas & Electric Company (SDG&E®) filed an application with the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) seeking authority to recover the costs associated with the San Onofre Nuclear Generating Station Units 2 and 3 (SONGS 2 & 3) on-going seismic program and new seismic study research projects and analyses.

SONGS is jointly owned by Southern California Edison (SCE), SDG&E, and the City of Riverside. SCE estimates that the total cost to the owners to perform the work requested in this application is \$64.0 million. This application requests authorization for SDG&E to recover its share (\$13.3 million) of the associated revenue requirements in rates. The total estimated cost of \$13.3 million will be recovered over a four-year period. SDG&E's cost recovery plan would result in annual costs of approximately \$4.7 million in 2012, \$4.4 million in 2013, \$3.3 million in 2014 and \$1.0 million in 2015. SDG&E estimates that the requested \$4.7 million increase in electric revenues for 2012 associated with the seismic program/studies would be allocated in a manner shown in the table below.

ILLUSTRATIVE EFFECT ON ELECTRIC RATES AND BILLS

If the CPUC approves SDG&E's request, a typical residential inland customer using 500 kilowatt-hours per month could see a monthly summer bill increase of 0.1%, or \$0.05, when compared to 4/01/11 Class Average Rates. A typical monthly electric bill could increase from \$80.99 to \$81.04. The following table shows an estimate of proposed revenue and rate changes by customer group that SDG&E is requesting in this application. The actual rates approved by the CPUC may be higher or lower than those requested by SDG&E.
