NOTICE OF PROPOSED CHANGE IN ELECTRIC RATES
TO RECOVER COSTS OF AN AGREEMENT WITH THE
LAWRENCE LIVERMORE NATIONAL LABORATORY
FOR 21ST CENTURY ENERGY SYSTEMS
APPLICATION NO. A.11-07-008

On July, 18, 2011, San Diego Gas & Electric Company (SDG&E®) filed a joint application filing with Pacific Gas and Electric Company and Southern California Edison Company (SCE) (collectively, "Utilities") with the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC). The joint application filing is seeking authority from the CPUC to recover the costs associated with a strategic applied research and development agreement between the Utilities and Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory. The agreement is known as the "California Energy Systems for the 21st Century Project" (Project).

The mission of the Project is to apply computationally based problem solving resources to the emerging energy challenges of the 21st century energy systems for the benefit of the Utilities' customers. The Project will consist of a consortium of the Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory and the joint utilities. The consortium will employ a joint team of technical experts who will combine data integration with the nation's most advanced modeling, simulation, and analytical tools to provide problem-solving and planning to achieve California's post-2020 energy and environmental goals applicable to the Utilities and their customers.

The joint utilities' application requests authorization for the Utilities to increase their electric and gas rates, where applicable, and charges to collect up to a maximum of \$15 million over five years. SDG&E seeks to recover its share (\$15 million) of the associated revenue requirements in electric rates over the five year period. Therefore SDG&E will increase its electric revenue requirements annually by approximately \$3 million in 2012 and this amount will remain in rates through the end of 2016.



Compared to revenue at present rates as of July 1, 2011, this application could result in a revenue increase of approximately \$3 million, or 0.1% beginning in 2012 and continuing through the end of 2016. If total rates were to change as requested, an average residential summer, inland customer using 500 kilowatt-hours (kWh) per month would see an increase of \$0.03 per month, from \$80.99 to \$81.02. The following table shows an estimate of proposed rate changes by customer group:

If this application is approved, the proposed change in rates for each customer class is as follows:

After considering all evidence presented during the formal hearing process, the assigned ALJ will issue a proposed decision. Because the CPUC's approvals may differ from those SDG&E requests, actual rates may differ from what is described in this notice.
