This modernization of the network that delivers electricity to customers is called the "smart grid". We're investing in technologies that allow us to manage the growing influx of renewable sources that are more environmentally friendly. Having your solar system connected to our "smart grid" will give you reliable electric service all year long.

Net energy metering

If you have an electricity generation system that uses renewables and your system produces more energy than you use, you can earn bill credits for excess power that flows from your system to the grid.

At times, renewable energy is unavailable or limited, like when the sun isn't shining or on cloudy days; and your system isn't producing enough electricity to meet your needs. On these days, you'll likely need to use SDG&E[®] as a source of back-up power or rely on the credits that you may have generated at an earlier time.

Getting started in three easy steps

Step 1: Take our Home Energy Survey

Making your home as energy efficient as possible is the first step before installing a solar energy system. Log in to My Account (*sdge.com/myaccount*), click on the "My Energy" tab, then click on "My Energy Survey". Taking our survey and providing details about your home's energy use can help you estimate how your home uses energy and where you can reduce to become more energy efficient. Once your home is as energy efficient as possible, you won't need as many solar panels installed, which could help save you money.

Step 2: Use the Solar Calculator to get an idea of the potential costs and savings

Log in to My Account (**sdge.com/myaccount**), click on the My Energy Tab, then click on "Saving with Solar Energy".

Step 3: Find a solar contractor and learn about financing and warranty options

Selecting a qualified contractor and knowing your financial options are key to a successful project. Search the web for a solar installer or equipment provider using the search term "Solar Energy Equipment and Systems Dealers". Ask about the company's experience as well as how much their services and products cost. It's also important to discuss equipment warranties. A solar power system is a valuable addition to your home which makes it important to ask about equipment warranties and maintenance plans. Finally, we recommend that you obtain at least three bids in writing from different solar companies and ask for references from other clients.
