NOTIFICATION OF JOINT UTILITY APPLICATION
FOR REVIEW OF MRTU COSTS AND NOTICE OF
POTENTIAL IMPACT ON ELECTRIC RATES
APPLICATION NO. 12-01-014

On January 31, 2012, San Diego Gas & Electric Company (SDG&E®), Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E®), and Southern California Edison Company (SCE®) (collectively, the Joint Utilities) jointly filed an application for consolidated review of Market Redesign and Technology Upgrade (MRTU) costs (Joint Application) with the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC). The Joint Application pertains to costs the Joint Utilities incurred to implement the California Independent System Operator's (CAISO) MRTU initiative to upgrade the efficiency of energy dispatch and improve the current wholesale electricity market system. In the Joint Application, SDG&E requests CPUC approval to recover the revenue requirement associated with the balance it accrued for the 12-month record period of January 1, 2010 through December 31, 2010 in the MRTU Memorandum Account (MRTUMA) authorized by the CPUC. Specifically, SDG&E is requesting cost recovery for the 2010 activity in the MRTUMA of approximately \$1.6 million. SDG&E received authorization to recover the balances generated in the MRTUMA prior to 2010 in Decision (D.) 11-10-029 approving its 2009 Energy Resource Recovery Account (ERRA) compliance review Application (A.) 10-06-001.

ILLUSTRATIVE IMPACT ON ELECTRIC RATES AND BILLS

If the CPUC approves SDG&E's request for recovery of the costs accrued during 2010 in the MRTUMA, a typical non-CARE residential customer living in the inland climate zone and using 500 kilowatt-hours per month could see a

monthly summer bill increase of 0.01%, or \$0.01. A typical monthly electric bill could increase from \$81.37 to \$81.38. The percentages shown do not necessarily reflect the changes that you may see on your bill. Changes in individual bills will also depend on how much electricity each customer uses.

EVIDENTIARY HEARINGS

Evidentiary Hearings (EHs) may be held whereby parties of record will present their testimony and are subject to cross-examination before an Administrative Law Judge (ALJ). These EHs are open to the public, but only those who are parties of record can present evidence or cross-examine witnesses during the evidentiary hearings. After considering all evidence presented during the formal hearing process, the assigned ALJ will issue a proposed decision. Because the CPUC's approvals may differ from those SDG&E requests, actual rates may differ from what is described in this notice.
