

**SAN DIEGO GAS & ELECTRIC COMPANY**  
**NOTIFICATION OF APPLICATION FOR**  
**EXPEDITED ERRA TRIGGER AND NOTICE**  
**OF POTENTIAL IMPACT ON ELECTRIC RATES**  
**APPLICATION NO. A.13-04-017**

On April 30, 2013, San Diego Gas & Electric Company (SDG&E®) filed its Expedited Energy Resource Recovery Account (ERRA) Trigger Application with the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) for approval to increase certain rates. The ERRA was established by the CPUC to record the utility's fuel and purchased power revenues against recorded costs, excluding costs and revenues related to the California Department of Water Resources (DWR).

Assembly Bill (AB) 57 mandated a trigger threshold for the balance in the ERRA of 5% of the electric utility's recorded generation revenues for the prior calendar year, excluding revenues collected for DWR. Under the CPUC's provisions of the trigger mechanism, SDG&E is required to file an expedited application to address the ERRA balance when it reaches an undercollection or overcollection of 4% and is projected to exceed the 5% trigger. SDG&E's balance exceeded the 5% trigger for the months of February and March 2013. Accordingly, SDG&E's Expedited ERRA Trigger Application seeks approval to collect the latest recorded monthly ERRA balance (excluding Greenhouse Gas compliance costs) known at the time of implementing the final decision and adding the best estimate of the balancing account's activity through the implementation date. For illustrative purposes, SDG&E provides the following rate impacts reflecting the collection of the currently forecasted undercollected balance for August 31, 2013, of \$108.5 million. These impacts assume that the new rates will begin with SDG&E's next anticipated rate change, currently expected on September 1, 2013, to be amortized over a 12-month period ending August 31, 2014.

ILLUSTRATIVE IMPACT ON ELECTRIC RATES AND BILLS

If the CPUC approves SDG&E's request, a typical non-CARE residential customer living in the inland climate zone and using 500 kilowatt-hours per month could see a monthly summer bill increase of 1.4%, or \$1.20. A typical monthly electric bill **could** increase from \$84.38 to \$85.58. Changes in individual bills will also depend on how much electricity each customer uses.

EVIDENTIARY HEARINGS

Evidentiary Hearings (EHs) may be held whereby parties of record will present their testimony and are subject to cross-examination before an Administrative Law Judge (ALJ). These EHs are open to the public, but only those who are parties of record can present evidence or cross-examine witnesses during the evidentiary hearings. After considering all evidence presented during the formal hearing process, the assigned ALJ will issue a proposed decision. Because the CPUC's approvals may differ from SDG&E's proposals, the actual rates adopted by the CPUC may differ from what is described in this notice.
