On April 19, 2017, San Diego Gas & Electric Company (SDG&E[®]) filed an application with the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) for approval to increase rates for six, long-term contracts for new electric resources, including two utility-owned energy storage contracts. SDG&E is seeking new long term contracts to meet local capacity needs in its electric service territories stemming from the retirement of the San Onofre Nuclear Generating Station (SONGS). The proposed contracts would provide new electric resources including electric storage (batteries) and demand response (reducing electric usage during high-demand periods and/or shift electric usage to other periods when electric demand is lower making more electricity available by curtailing electricity at dedicated times). Electric customers in SDG&E's service territory would also receive grid (electric network infrastructure) reliability benefits for the duration of the contracts.

The typical SDG&E utility bill includes charges for the cost of electricity and the cost to deliver (transmission and distribution) electricity. This application requests cost recovery from all customers in SDG&E's service territory, even the customers who purchase electricity from another provider but pay SDG&E to distribute the electricity to their homes. These costs are shared by all customers because these contracts provide reliability benefits to everyone within the service territory. The total cost of the six contracts over their respective contract terms is approximately \$235 million. The provided rate recovery amount excludes the cost of energy for electric storage batteries. Please note that the total cost is based on forecasts and is likely to change prior to including the actual cost in electric rates.

The chart shown inside illustrates the increase in rates that would result from CPUC approval of this application, compared to current rate levels.

ILLUSTRATIVE IMPACT ON ELECTRIC RATES AND BILLS

If the CPUC approves SDG&E's application, a typical non-CARE (CARE is a low-income assistance program) residential customer living in the inland climate zone and using 500 kilowatt-hours per month could see a monthly summer bill increase of 0.5%, or \$0.59, from a current monthly bill of \$125.36 to \$125.95. The illustrative rate and bill impacts assume all contracts are in effect and provide a comparison to current (3/1/2017) rates. The dollar amounts and percentages shown below are estimates and do not necessarily reflect the exact changes you may see in your bill. Changes in individual bills will depend on how much energy each customer uses.

CPUC PROCESS

This application will be assigned to an Administrative Law Judge (Judge) who will determine how to receive evidence and other related documents, necessary for the CPUC to establish a record upon which to base its decision. Evidentiary hearings may be held where parties of record will present their testimony and may be subject to cross-examination by other parties. These evidentiary hearings are open to the public, but only those who are parties of record can participate.

After considering all proposals and evidence presented during the formal hearing process, the assigned Judge will issue a proposed decision which may adopt SDG&E's proposal, modify it or deny it. Any CPUC Commissioner may sponsor an alternate decision. The proposed decision, and any alternate decisions, will be discussed and voted upon at a scheduled CPUC Voting Meeting.

As a party of record, the Office of Ratepayer Advocates (ORA) will review this application. ORA is the independent consumer advocate within the CPUC with a legislative mandate to represent investor-owned utility customers to obtain the lowest possible rate for service consistent with reliable and safe service levels. ORA has a multi-disciplinary staff with expertise in economics, finance, accounting and engineering.
