# Choose your monthly bill date with Select-A-Cycle

Would you like to change the approximate time of month that your SDG&E® bill is due? Ask about our new **Select-A-Cycle** option by calling **1-800-411-7343** for your home energy bill or **1-800-336-7343** for your business. This service is at no extra cost to you.

An energy service specialist will check to make sure your account is eligible for Select-A-Cycle, then if it is, switch it to the meter-reading/billing cycle that typically comes closest to the time of month you'd like to receive your bill. The actual date will vary from month to month, depending on the number of weekends and holidays between billing cycles. Bills are still due upon receipt, and payable within 15 days for nonresidential bills and 19 days for residential bills.

# Get a smart thermostat at no cost when you sign up for Reduce Your Use™ Rewards

You can receive a smart thermostat valued at \$300, including installation in your home, at no cost when you sign up for Reduce Your Use<sup>SM</sup> Rewards. This offer is good only while supplies last, so visit **sdge.com/thermostat** today to see if your home qualifies.

By signing up for Reduce Your Use Rewards, you'll be eligible to receive automatic bill credits for saving enough electricity during certain peak-use times. You can receive alerts by voice mail, email or text. With the smart thermostat, you'll be able to remotely control temperature settings on your central air conditioner from your mobile device or computer.

# Request this alert if heat is harmful to your health

If extreme heat would be harmful to the health of anyone living in your home and a moderate indoor temperature is a must, be sure to enroll in SDG&E's **Temperature Sensitive Program**. With this no-cost service, you'll receive advance notice of state-directed power outages. An automated phone call will alert you to prepare for a temporary loss of air conditioning.

If you participate in SDG&E's **Medical Baseline Program**, then you're already on the call list for outage notices and do not need to enroll in the Temperature Sensitive Program.

We'll check our electric equipment to make sure our system remains ready to serve your area. By calling us as early as possible, you - or the contractor who will be doing your electrical work - can help prevent local system overloads, outages and power quality problems, such as low voltage or flickering lights.

For work on your side of the meter including your electrical panel and all internal wiring at your home or business be sure to consult with a licensed electrician.
