SAN DIEGO GAS & ELECTRIC COMPANY NOTICE OF REVISED GENERAL RATE CASE PHASE 2 PROPOSING NEW REVENUE ALLOCATIONS AND RATE DESIGN THAT CHANGE HOW SDG&E ALLOCATES COSTS AMONG ELECTRIC CUSTOMERS APPLICATION A.11-10-002

On March 30, 2012, San Diego Gas & Electric Company (SDG&E[®]) served revised testimony in its General Rate Case (GRC) Phase 2 application (A.11-10-002) with the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC or Commission), asking for approval to change certain electric rates for our customers. The application proposes no changes to total revenue because revenue increases were requested and are being considered in SDG&E's Phase 1 GRC (A.10-12-005), filed on December 15, 2010. The current application proposes new revenue allocations and rate design that change how we allocate costs among our electric customers. Electric utility charges on your bill include revenues for transmission (the process of moving energy from one region to another), distribution (the process of delivering energy at the local level) and energy. Both electric distribution and electric energy rates are changed in this application. This application requests no changes to gas rates. If approved as filed, SDG&E customers would see the changes described here.

EFFECT ON ELECTRIC RATES AND BILLS

If the Commission approves SDG&E's request, a typical residential customer living in the inland climate zone and using 500 kWh per month will see a monthly summer bill increase beginning in January 2013 of 0.7%, or \$0.59. A typical monthly electric bill will increase from \$81.37 to \$81.96. The percentages shown do not necessarily reflect the changes that you may see in your bill. Changes in individual bills will depend on how much energy each customer uses. The following chart shows the electric rate changes SDG&E is requesting for 2013.

The system total increase reflects 2012 test year sales forecasted by SDG&E in A.10-12-005, SDG&E's GRC Phase 1 Application filed in December 2010. The typical monthly residential electric bill may be further impacted by SDG&E's proposed introduction of a basic service fee.
